Directions

From Parish:

Take Rt. 69 East for 9 miles in to Amboy Center. Turn left on to Rt. 183. Go north for 4 miles; entrance is on the right.

From Pulaski:

Take Rt. 13 South to Williamstown. Turn right on to Rt. 183. The entrance will be on the left after 1 mile.

From Camden:

Take Rt. 13 North to Williamstown. Turn left on to Rt. 183. The entrance will be on the left after 1 mile.

From Oswego:

Take Rt. 104 East until it ends at the junction of Rt. 13. Turn right on to Rt. 13. Follow instructions "From Pulaski."

From Syracuse:

Take I-81 North to Parish; exit 33 (Rt. 69). Follow instructions "From Parish."

Public programs often feature guest presenters who are recognized leaders in the fields of wildlife management, outdoor education, and botany. It is also the Center's belief that learning should be fun.



On-site Facilities

The Amboy 4-H Environmental Education Center is available for overnight use and groups may use our lodges and/or pavillions for programs and activities.

Center's Mission

The Amboy 4-H Environmental Education Center promotes responsible stewardship of our environment.

As part of Cornell Cooperative Extension of Oswego County 4-H, the hands-on programs of the Center develops a greater appreciation, awareness, and understanding of the natural world and people's role in it.

The Center is open year round, from dawn until dusk, for the public to enjoy. Special events and programs are also regularly scheduled to allow youth and adults interact more closely with mother nature.



Buildings and Grounds

Evergreen Lodge: Provides dormitory and restroom facilities. Up to 60 people can sleep in the lodge and the restroom facilities include shower stalls.

Dunn Lodge: Main meeting and kitchen facility. Kitchen contains two refrigerators, stove, microwave, pots and pans, plates, glasses, and utensils. Blackboard, tables, and chairs are also a part of the lodge.

Don MacVean Pavilion: Seats up to 200 people

Miller Cabin Nature Museum: Open upon request.

*Dunn and Evergreen Lodges each have telephone (for emergency use only), electricity, running water, and a woodstove.
Both facilities are wheelchair accessible.*
